Professor Carol Chin (she/her)

Carol Chin is Principal of Woodsworth College and an Associate Professor in the Department of History. Her research focuses on late nineteenth- through twentieth-century American foreign relations, especially U.S.-East Asian relations. Her particular interest is in the intersection of national identity with concepts of empire, culture, and gender and the ways in which these themes can enhance the study of international relations. She is the author of “Beneficent Imperialists: American Women Missionaries in China at the Turn of the Century” (Diplomatic History 2003); “Translating the New Woman: Chinese Feminists View the West, 1905-1915” (Gender and History 2006); and *Modernity and National Identity in the United States and East Asia, 1895–1919* (Kent State University Press 2010). Of Chinese extraction, Professor Chin was born and raised in the United States and came to Canada in 2003. Since last year Professor Chin has been Co-Chair of the Anti-Asian Racism Working Group.
